Կիրակի, 17 Մայիսի 2020-ի առաւօտն է։ Աղօթքս կատարեցի եւ խաղաղ սրտով կը պատրաստուիմ մասնակցիլ ս. պատարագին։ Արդէն երրորդ ամիսն է, համաճարակի մեկուսացման շրջանին գուցէ աւարտին ենք հասած։ Իւրովի խորհրդածութիւններս ինձ մտածել կու տան, թէ ինչպէ՞ս կարելի եղաւ տոկալ կեանքի այս տարօրինակ իրավիճակին, որն եւ պարտադրուեցաւ ողջ աշխարհի վրայ զգուշաւորութիւն դրսեւորելու ու համաճարակի տարածումը կասեցնելու համար։ Պատասխանն այն է, որ Աստուած բոլորիս մէջ աւելցուց գիտակցութեան ու համբերութեան չափը եւ ի մասնաւորի աղօթքով զօրացած դիմագրաւելու այս փորձութիւնը եւս։

Աստուած ամենակարող, Քեզի կու գամ այս առաւօտ եւ աղօթքի այս բառերով կը սկսիմ կիրակին։ «Տէ՛ր, եթէ զշրթունս իմ բանամ, բերան իմ երգեսցէ զօրինութիւնս Քո»։

Իրօք երանելի է այն մարդը, որ օրը կը սկսի Աստուծոյ հետ, աղօթքով առաջնորդուած կեանքի խոստումով։ Որովհետեւ երբ կեանքը կ'ապրինք Աստուծոյ հետ եւ այն կը խմորենք աղօթքի ապրումներով, ապա այդ կեանքը խաղաղ է ու շնորհաբաշխ։

Այս Կիրակի, գուցէ առաջին անգամն ըլլալով, ես ինձ հարց կու տամ, թէ ինչու՞ համար եւ ինչպէ՞ս է, որ մարդիկ չարին դերակատարողը կը դառնան եւ պատուիարտուի կողմէ ուղղորդուած կը միտին արատաւորել մարդուն կեանքը առանց հիմնաւորումի։ Բնական է՝ այդպիսիք ոչ միայն անհատին կրնան կամ կը փորձեն նեղութիւն պատճառել, բայց առաւել եւս խանգարել նաեւ համայնքին կեանքը։ Այդպիսիք կը յաջողին ժամանակի մը համար,

բայց կր մոռնան, որ արդարութիւնը թերեւս կ'ուշանալ, բայց ի վերջոյ կը հասնի։ Եւ գուցէ Աստուած առիթ կ՛ընծայէ, որ չարանենգ խորհուրդներով առաջնորդուած մարդիկ ունենան անդրադարձումի ու զոջումի պահը, եւ եթէ այդ տեղի չ՛ունենար, արդէն Աստուած կր կատարէ դատաստանը։ Աիա նոյն փորձառութեան մէջէն կ'անցնիմ նաեւ ես, եւ մամոնայի ծառաներ, որպէսզի ծածկեն իրենց անիրաւութիւնները, կը փորձեն եւ շատ դառն հարուածներով կ'աշխատին արատաւորել ինձ, մոռնալով սակայն, որ ի տարբերութիւն իրենց կեանքի ճանապարհին իմ կեանքը մութ չէ եւ ոչ այ հանգուցաւորուած տարիներու վրալ բարդուած անիրաւութիւններով ու խարդախութիւններով։ Եւ փառբ Աստուծոլ, խաղաղ է հոգիս ու խիղճս, եւ այդ է նաեւ պատճառը, որ անիիմն ժայռակերտ քարեր չեն կրնար կործանել ինձ։ Անշուշտ կր ցաւիմ, եւ սակայն հաւատքս իր արմատն է գտած Աստուծոյ մեջ եւ նոյն հաւատբով աղօթբս կը բարձրացնեմ առ Աստուած աղօթբի այս բառերով, որոնց մեջ գտած եմ ի մանկութենէ եւ այսօր ուղին իմ կեանքին. «*SL'ր, եթէ գշրթունս իմ* բանաս, բերան իմ երգեսցէ գօրինութիւնս Քո»։

ՏԷր իմ Աստուած, Դուն ես Քննողը մարդկանց սիրտերուն։ Քու Աջին զօրութիւնով ամրացուց զիս գիշեր ու ցերեկ։ Պիտի շարունակեմ Քայլել Քու ուղեգծած ճանապարհեն եւ Քու խօսբերը պիտի դարձնեմ լոյսը իմ կեանբին։ ԻնչՔան փորձութիւններ կը շրջապատեն ինձ, այնՔան կ'առատացնես իմ մէջ համբերութեան չափը եւ աւելին հաւատՔս կր դարձնես անդրդուելի։

«Եկեղեցին անարատ Մայր է եւ անկէ կը ծնինք լոյսի եւ ճշմարտութեան զաւակներ, եւ ան մեզի համար կեան-Քի լոյս է եւ անով կը գտնենք հոգիի փրկութիւնը, եւ ան մեզի համար արդարութեան ճամբայ է եւ անով կ'ելլենք մեր Երկնաւոր Յօր Քրիստոսի մօտ»։

Դռնբացեբի արարողակարգեն քաղուած այս հաստատումը արդարեւ կը խօսի եկեղեցւոյ առաբելութեան մասին։ Ս. Մկրտութեամբ հոգեւորապես կը վերածնինք, որպես որդեգիր զաւակներ Աստուծոյ, որպես «լոյսի եւ ճշմարտութեան զաւակներ»։

Փորձութեան այս օրեր շուտով կ'անցնին, եւ երբ դէպի բնական կեանք կը վերադառնանք, հետեւինք Դռնբացեբի արարողութենեն քաղուած պատգամին, որպեսզի մեր մեջ նորոգենք կոչումը քրիստոնեական, ուխտը՝ եկեղեցւոյ ծառայութեան, եւ մեր հոգու հայեացքն ուղղենք առ Աստուած։ Այս իմաստով անցնող օրերն ու ամիսները ինձ համար եւ վստահօրեն շատերու համար եւս եղան լուսաւորութեան օրեր։
